

Missouri's Unemployment Insurance (UI) Online Claims Filing System can help you file new, renewed, or weekly unemployment claims at no cost. It can take 18 to 22 days to receive payment for a new claim and there is a 10 day processing period for renewed claims. Visit <https://uninteract.labor.mo.gov/> to sign up.
