

TRADE ADJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE (TAA) FROM YOUR MISSOURI JOB CENTERS

TAA assists workers who become totally or partially unemployed as a result of increased imports or movement of business operations to a foreign country. Workers can participate if they are dislocated from companies that have been TAA-certified by the U.S. Department of Labor.

- On-The-Job Training (OJT)

TO OBTAIN THESE BENEFITS, YOU HAVE TO TAKE THE NEXT STEPS:

File an unemployment claim: File online at www.uinteract.labor.mo.gov or telephone the Claims Center to file a **new** unemployment claim or to file a **renewed** claim. If you are in the **local calling area** for one of these cities, call:

From elsewhere in Missouri, call the Claims Center toll-free at 1-800-320-2519.

File a Trade Readjustment Allowance (TRA) claim: You still need to file your TRA claim online at www.uinteract.labor.mo.gov <u>or</u> telephone the claims center, even if you **already** filed your unemployment claim. Use the same number from Step 1. The calling system is automated and responds to your voice. When asked to choose your option, ask to speak to a claims representative.

3 If filing your TRA Claim through the Claim Center, tell the Claims Representative you need to file a TRA claim: Have your personal information and details about your last employer in front of you to help you answer the Claim Representative's questions. (If you had a **prior** TRA claim in the past, your old TRA records will also need to be updated with information about your most recent separation from work.)

Visit your local Missouri Job Center: Go in person as soon as you get your eligibility letter from the Division of Employment Security. During your first visit to the Job Center, please notify the receptionist of your Trade Act eligibility.

Have questions? Telephone the Claims Center number from Step 1 if you have questions about your unemployment claim or about your TRA benefits. Use the same procedure with the automated system that you used in Step 2; when asked to choose your option, ask to speak to a claims representative. You can call Monday through Friday between 8 AM and 5 PM.

IMPORTANT:

To be **eligible** for weekly TRA benefits, you must be **enrolled** in training or have been issued a waiver of training requirements within a set time frame from your separation date. Your local Missouri Job Center staff will assist you with training and waiver requirements.
